## MCC to source for funds to resurface damaged roads

MIRI: Miri City Council (MCC) will source for additional funds to resurface roads that are affected by the building of the sewerage project.

Mayor Adam Yii in a statement yesterday said the extensive excavations and tunnelling works being carried out for the sewerage project had caused much disruption to public roads, inconveniencing the road users.

He said they had received many complaints, saying the road reinstatement works was not up to the standards, causing much inconvenience to the

public.

"We will source for additional funds to resurface the roads properly once the project is completed in the near future."

He thus urged road users to take extra caution when approaching any of the sewerage project sites.

The project, which comes under Sarawak Sewerage Services Department, has been ongoing for the past four years. It started on March 30, 2017, and is supposed to complete by June this year.

However, the project has been delayed due to the movement control order (MCO) caused by the Covid-19 pandemic.

"Once completed, the management of sewage and wastewater treatment will be better managed.

"We will approach the Sarawak Sewerage Services Department to rectify the shortfalls and take positive steps to mitigate the inconveniences," he said.
